New Orleans saxophonist, Derek Douget, Returns for Jazz Residency March 11-15

- Douget to teach jazz clinics at schools across Santa Barbara county

Santa Barbara, CA, February 14, 2019 – On the heels of a successful inaugural season, the Lobero Brubeck Circle of donors is thrilled to welcome jazz saxophonist Derek Douget back to Santa Barbara for the second Brubeck Jazz residency program. March 11-15 will see Derek and his collaborators on a busy week-long tour across Santa Barbara county providing customized in-classroom instruction to jazz students from junior high through college. Douget will then cap off the week with a [performance](#) at the Lobero Theatre on Friday, March 15 at 8 PM.

Derek Douget, a member of the Ellis Marsalis Quartet and the Director of the Heritage School of Music, finely mixes his Louisiana upbringing with his strong individualism and idiosyncratic voice. Playing the alto and soprano saxophones, Douget has performed with many notable musicians on the New Orleans scene, including the Louis Armstrong Quintet, Nicolas Payton, Ellis Marsalis, Dr. John, Terence Blanchard, Allen Toussaint, Branford Marsalis, Dee Dee Bridgewater, Wyclif Jean, Jason Marsalis, Kermit Ruffins, Stefon Harris and many others.
